Also noteworthy is the Roxinho wood, which appears in the helical joint of the legs and in the centre of the flowers in the shade.

Discreetly embedded electrical wire inside one of the legs, preserving the design of the piece.






Its exterior wooden shade has a unique design represented by a random mosaic inlaid on each of its four faces.






Made of Freijó wood, the HORÁCIO bench has an organic, light and innovative design, with continuous lines and rounded corners. All the curves are handmade. The shape of the bench is asymmetrical, both in the backrest and in the seat. The seat is split. Backrest and arms are joined in a single structure. The piece highlights the natural tones and designs of the wood, without the use of dyes.

LÉO armchair





To develop the Léo armchair, Chico Margarita selected several aspects that he really likes in a piece of furniture and that make it comfortable to look at: sinuosity, proportionality, organicity, without corners or abrupt breaks in the design, like the curves of the human body. The armchair is neither big nor small, the seat is comfortable, wide at the front and smaller at the back, and it is lower at the back, which makes it more comfortable to sit on.


The result is an affectionate and contemporary design combined in this armchair.

The piece is made of Imbuia wood. The fittings and details on the backrest are in Freijó.

The manufacturing process is artisanal, adopting traditional carpentry practices. The wood is cut using molds. The fine adjustment of the fittings and the rounding of the entire piece are done manually. The manual process allows the piece to be polished, making it unique, hand-carved, with the sensitivity to work each curve.

ABRAÇO 1, 2 and 3 armchair



Series of 3 armchairs, true sculptures in raw wood, entirely handmade and distinguished by their seats. Exclusive design (backrest and seat shape), organic seat.

Armchair 1 with a smooth seat, all in wood.


Armchairs 2 and 3 adopt marquetry - an ancient technique that has been used since the beginning of the history of furniture, but which has ceased to be used due to the difficulty of scaling it up industrially - but here with an innovative application on the seat.

Armchair 2, with inlay (marquetry) on part of the seat, representing a branch of Ginkgo Biloba leaves.

Armchair 3, with marquetry on the entire seat - the marquetry is a geometric formation inspired by the Ginkgo Biloba leaf, bringing this element of nature into the creation.





OThe seat and backrest were practically hand-sculpted, to the point of feeling "now, yes, now it's the way I want it". This may sound strange to the more methodical and pragmatic, who follow absolutely rigorous production standards. But, for Chico Margarita, art is like this and has to be like this. There has to be a good space to give vent to the feeling of the piece and how it wants to be born into the world, to perceive what makes sense for each one.



Stool with a wide, ergonomic seat, making the most of the angles of the crossbars and daring in the overall design.

An extremely comfortable and solid wood chair, due to its organic light design with continuous lines and rounded corners.

Practically a sculpture in rough wood, due to the absence of straight lines.

Slightly turned-out feet and masterful joints provide increased durability and stability. Polished with waxes and natural oils, the chair has an extremely soft and warm texture, as well as highlighting the original wood grain, maintaining its natural appearance.

TORII bench





TORII (鳥居) is a traditional Japanese portal, linked to the Shinto religion, which marks the entrance or proximity to a shrine. More than an architectural ornament, it symbolizes the opening to a divine state, the passage from the mundane (material) to the sacred. The Japanese believe that, when passing through TORII, the person is entering a sacred environment. In Japanese, TORII means "home of the birds", after all it is in this Japanese portal that the birds settle down as on perches. For the Japanese people, birds help the deities.

According to legend, the solar goddess Amaterasu would have ended her period of recollection and solitude, where she saw no light, in honor of the birds. Thus, the TORII receives the light and also the divine spirit, through its beams.

Like this bench, the TORII is usually made of wood. Its columns (or the feet, in the case of the stool) represent the foundations that support the sky, while the beams (represented on the bench by the sleepers and seats), symbolize the earth.






When an artist develops a new piece, he inevitably draws on the experiences, repertoires, images, sensations and inspirations that he carries within himself. All of these, mixed together, added to his intuition and wrapped up in his own work, materialize in the new creation.

Therefore, even if he chooses to apply universal aesthetic elements to the new piece, the authorial designer always adds his own touches. And in the case of artisanal production with wood, we are being literal when we say this.

In the options Imbuia, Freijó and Sucupira.

RONI stools



A creation that was based on the search for the beauty of organic sinuosity and proportionality, together with comfort. All curves were made by hand, without the use of templates, by feeling and touching the piece.

RONI stools were designed in a time of farewells and reflections. A moment when we had the opportunity to look inside ourselves, to see better the world and the life we chose to have, fundamental for our self-knowledge, and as a result, the importance of polishing the "seat" in which we want to support our lives.



A pair of stools with the same structure (feet and sleepers), but with separate and complementary seats, which fit together.

All made with Freijó wood.

The seats are rounded, organic, fluid, and very trademark features of Chico Margarita's design, which bring delicacy. The solid wood structure gives durability to the piece.

The sleepers that join the feet at the bottom reinforce its organic design.

ÍRIS

(38 cm width x 38 cm length x 42 cm height)

The **Iris** flower was named after the goddess of mythology, Iris, who was known for being a messenger who used the rainbow as transportation. Because of the various colours that this flower can have, it was named this way.

MARGARIDAS

(35 cm width x 35 cm length x 42 cm height)

A delicate, simple flower from the countryside. From the games of love-me-nots. This flower, which loves the sun, represents purity, of body and spirit, innocence, sensitivity, childhood and youth, love, and also peace, kindness and affection. Daisy comes from the Latin name MARGARITA, coming from the Greek margarites, which means "pearl". The Greeks acquired this name from the Persian murvarid, murwari, which originally meant "creature of light".

LÍRIO

(40 cm width x 28 cm length x 42 cm height)

U One of the meanings attributed to the word Lily is Eternal Love. It was given this name by the Chinese people, who have cultivated the species for many centuries. In China, it means abundance and is the flower associated with the arrival of Summer. In many other parts of the world, lilies are considered the kings of flowers.











JUNI armchair



The JUNI Chair was created based on its older sister, the CABRAL Stool. A continuation of the same design, but now, a Chair.

A chair design with armchair features. Functional and, at the same time, providing the comfort of an armchair. All this without losing the organicity, design and innovation of the form.

SÃO JOSÉ table

Joseph, husband of Mary, father of Jesus. Protector of Workers and Families, is venerated as SAINT JOSEPH in several churches and cities around the world. Loved by his son Jesus and sanctified by Catholics, Joseph is also known for being a worker and carpenter. It is no coincidence that Carpenter's Day (March 19) is celebrated on Saint Joseph's Day. Personally, I find it special to have the same profession as Jesus' father. I am proud of him for being who he is. I also find it curious to think that, 2,000 years ago, there were people who worked like I do. And many of the tools are even the same as those of that time.


I pay homage to him with this beautiful and unique table, created to bring the family together in a beautiful house in the TERRAS DE SÃO JOSÉ CONDOMINIUM, in Itú – SP

NIn this piece, the curves on the legs break up the straight, common lines that we normally see on table legs.

On the top, I opted for a very subtle design by intentionally converting the grain to the center of the table, highlighting the natural patterns of the wood.

In the center of the top, I applied subtle, discreet, and elegant marquetry.

CLOSE table



The CLOSE table was designed in a different time. A moment when we 'closed' ourselves to the outside world and 'got closer' to our essence. We had the opportunity to look inside ourselves, to evaluate ourselves, to see better the world we live in and the life we choose to have.

'Close' can have the meaning of 'zoom, close-up'. Focus on what you want to see with more attention, on the details that really matter. It can be 'near', being close to who matters. It can be 'not open'. Close yourself to what is just interference, distraction, pollution and open yourself to what really matters.

Quarantine - great invitation to discover what really matters. Yes, this table was born special.

Side table with marquetry top. A creation that involved 3 different styles of surface adornment: the marquetry itself, the background and the engraving, composing an innovative design style. Almost all made with Freijó wood, which appears massively in its structure (head, feet and sleepers). A rounded piece, without edges, fluid, very trademark features of Chico Margarita's design that bring finesse while translating durability and robustness through the solid wood structure. The asymmetrical sleepers, which join the feet at the bottom, reinforce its organic design.







PERRI table



...it all started with a few scribbles on a very small piece of paper that our friend Adriana made.

From that initial idea, we were inspired and created the PERRI table. Pau Ferro top with metal fillet inlays and Freijó legs. The geometry of the top is represented in an original way through the openwork elements of the legs.










GUELFI table



A beautiful coffee table, with solid wood structure and glass top, highlighting the unique design of the base.

The curved design is evident and brings out the natural lines. Each face of the wooden structure is unique, differing from the others.

MANDALAS table



On the top, the incredible beauty of our Freijó wood and the marquetry work with different types of wood.

MANDALA, which in Sanskrit means "circle", is a representation of the dynamic relationship between man and the cosmos, through concentric geometric shapes and more or less regular subdivisions.

For many, the MANDALA is just a decorative object, but it means much more than that.

It is present in Hinduism, Buddhism and Taoism.

In Catholic churches, between the 16th and 18th centuries, it was used to decorate walls and stained-glass windows.


The first MANDALAS appeared in the 8th century, in India. Soon after, they were also seen in China and Japan.

In Tibet, this type of painting is widely used, mainly by Buddhist monks to help with concentration and meditation.

It is referred to by the expression "Khyil-Khor": center of the Universe, in which the Divine and Enlightened Being resides.

WOODEN MANDALAS are also a Buddhist tradition, representing the dwelling place of some sacred deity.

For this reason, they are often used as gifts.





TINA table





The TINA Table is a glass-topped table with solid wood frame made from Freijó.

With an EXCLUSIVE design, consisting in the total absence of corners, it accentuates the organic design that marks the work of designer CHICO MARGARITA.

Sits 10 people comfortably and the colour of the glass on the top can be chosen by the customer - the full colour palette is available.





For a nation that, like others, has its virtues, but where education and respect for traditions are inherent in its culture.

It is no coincidence that they have the oldest continuous monarchy in the world, now in its 125th dynasty.

Congratulations to the descendants of Jimmul Congratulations to the Chrysanthemum Throne (菊-Kiku) and especially the Peoplel



Made from Pau Marfim wood, with handles and drawer structures in Freijó, it has a slender and clean design. The arrangement of the two drawers on opposite sides give the piece the balance it needs. The legs are organic and delicate, though solid in design.

The flower marquetry is original and continuous, occupying two planes front and top. The Chrysanthemum is the symbol of the Japanese Imperial family. It perfectly and masterly represents the sun and it depicts more than 300 open petals, giving it a unique, distinctive and elegant appearance. It signifies longevity, rejuvenation, prosperity, friendship, joy, optimism and faithfulness...

In Japanese culture, the cherry tree (Sakura 桜) was associated with the samurai, whose life of servitude was as ephemeral as the brevity of the flower that grows on the tree



Chest of drawers with marquetry on top and sides, in a continuous design. Almost entirely made from Freijó which makes up the structure and facing of the drawers.

The marquetry of this piece represents the cherry blossom, a tree originally from Asia, forming a continuous design, which runs through two sides of the furniture - the front and the top. Due to the complexity of the design, three distinct marquetry techniques were required. The front projection of the piece makes it lighter and more modern, highlighting the design of the natural wood veins.

Precise dovetail drawer fixtures translate into durability and quality.








ANNERIS cabinet





The ANNERIS drink cabinet is made up of 2 parts: its base, made from Freijó rough wood, with the characteristic organic trait of the designer's work; and the upper part is the closet itself.

Marquetry makes a continuous design on all four faces, using woods such as Pau-Ferro, Ebonized Oak, Pioppo and Freijó.

Cabinet doors open with only a light touch. The inside features a drawer with one-touch opening and built-in niches, soft LED lighting that automatically lights up when opening the doors, and a glass top shelf.

The marquetry design represents the leaves of the Ginkgo Biloba tree. A rare Asian tree (ginkyo: 銀杏), considered almost a living fossil, as one of the oldest species of plants that still exist (270 million years old), of extreme beauty and a history of inspiring resilience.


Ginkgo Biloba is a symbol of peace and longevity.

It survived atomic bombs in Japan and its resistance goes far beyond. It withstood glacial periods, pests, and adverse environmental elements that eliminated other species. Its fame caused it to be studied extensively and, consequently, it was discovered that the leaves have extensive medicinal uses.

The marquetry is made with Freijó, Sucupira and Italian oak, with inlaid filaments of gold metal. The screen consists of 3 panels interconnected by hinges entirely made from wood.

Environmental Partnership



CHICO MARGARITA and the NGO Green Initiative, through the "Friends of the Forest" program, are partners in the reforestation of the Atlantic Forest.

Each piece sold by CHICO MARGARITA Atelier contributes part of its revenue to replant 1 to 10 native trees in the forest.

This program also helps to recover the rivers and springs (riparian forests) of the Cantareira System..

Our good environmental practices



- ❖ In our studio, we revere wood it is the centerpiece of our production, with its natural colours, without dyes or toners. The finishes used are based on tung oil*, carnauba wax and beeswax. Raw materials of renewable origin, biodegradable and with low environmental impact.
- ❖ The wood used in our pieces is Brazilian and of legal origin, certified by DOF (Document of Forest Origin).
- We reuse as much wood waste as possible in our production.
- ❖ Our products are delivered packaged in reforested pine wood boxes. All internal packaging is made of Craft paper and cardboard, with minimal adhesive tape and no plastic. Upon deliveries, we bring back the boxes, which will be used again in future deliveries.
- ❖ Our furniture, lamps and paintings, because they are artistic and handmade, are not disposable pieces or that follow trends. They are timeless, special pieces, made to last and accompany the life of those who chose them.
